





4. Click on the RootsMagic icon on your desktop after downloading the program, and this welcome screen opens. Click on Create a new file.



5. **Or** if you closed the welcome window, click on the blank page to start a blank program.



6. Preference window opens. Indicate where data should be stored, and how you want the data displayed.

• File location —

If on a hard drive, usually called C: -- remember to write down the file's name (such as kcliff RM7) and the drive folder

 Check the boxes as shown in blue.




7. Notice a blank window where you can enter a name to a pedigree file.




8. To pull the information on your family already loaded at FSFT, click on the File icon and scroll down to the **Import** icon. Click this icon.




9. A FamilySearch Central Sign In window opens. If working on your own computer check the box to remember your user name and password to speed up work in the future.




10. Notice you are now **Logged In** ... click Import




11. Enter the FSFT ID # and indicate how many generations to import. No more than four at a time is best.




# 12. Notice any new information and AutoMatch features.



13. Add Information about you, living people, or an ancestor by clicking on any of the Add Person reminders in pedigree charts or family group records.




#### 14. Find any duplicates in your files by clicking on Tools, then select Merge, then Manual Merge






17. Swap the duplicate with the original primary because the duplicate has more sources and data by clicking on the "Swap" button in the bottom center of the screen.





# Now your family files are in RootsMagic



- Next standardize the format and spelling of all names, dates, and localities. See Topic 3, page 8 of training packet.
- Use finding aids (like state Gazetteers, the Handybook) for Genealogists, the Redbook, or Animap) to determine the proper locations for each place of birth, marriage, death or burial including the proper names of counties during the event particular time period.
- RootsMagic now has Ancestry integration.



#### Affiliate Data Entry

- Entering data in a stand-alone affiliate genealogy database program (GDP) is somewhat different than entering the same information into FamilySearch Family Tre (FSFT). With a GDP, the data remains in your possession. FSFT is a Mega Database Manager made up of multiple search engines that search numerous databases of its own and works with many affiliated database managers and software programs.
- It is best to stick to the methods desired by FamilySearch as far as entering names, places, and sources from their own system. This is because it contributes to a database for the world, and you will want to link and share information from your system (RootsMagic, Legacy, or Ancestral Quest) with FamilySearch.
- When entering data into a GDP, you can abbreviate, but then your localities and dates will not work with the FSFT search engines.
- Surnames, in a GDP, can be set to capitalize surnames, but you must change them to upper and lower case if you sync your records.
- Enter locations into a GDP in four levels from smallest to largest and indicate missing levels with a comma, but do not separate with commas in FSFT. Thus a standardized location for Provo would be "Provo, Utah, Utah, United States" in both a GDP and FSFT, but if you did not know the county for Provo in a GDP you could put Provo,, Utah, United States, but no extra commas in FSFT.
