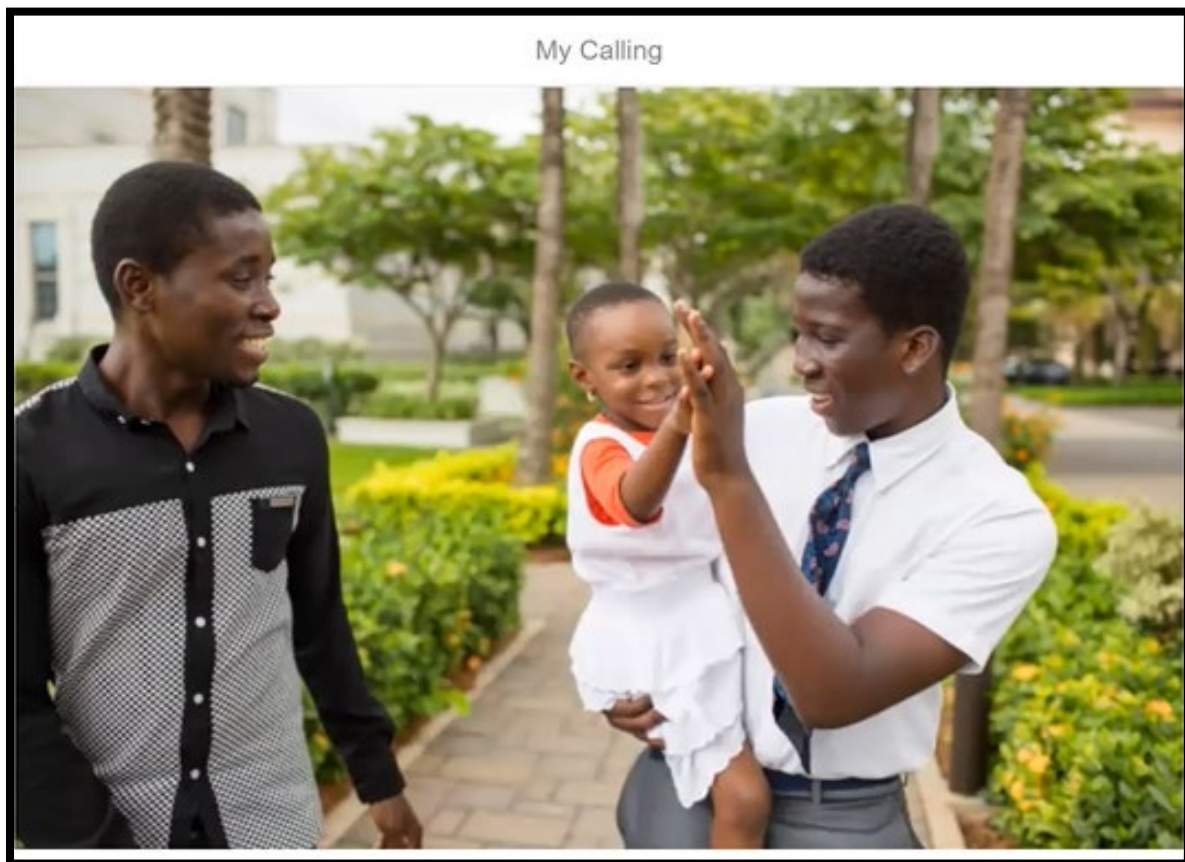


Summary of Meeting given on Zoom 9 June 2021.

Index at home (on-line); make a journal entry; merge duplicates at FamilySearch.org; add family images into memories via cell phone; prepare a relative's name to take to the temple, replace abbreviations and standardize names and places to help FamilySearch do research for you; do a family activity from FamilySearch.org, record a family story in memories or with the memories app; enjoy Rootstech training on-line and free with over 1500 sessions (most are between 15 and 20 minutes long), volunteer to help others at the Family History Center annex across from the Stake President's offices at the Stake Center from 7 to 9 p.m., or visit www.provoeastfhc.org website and catch up on lessons you may have missed in the past.
